## PACS SESSION TIEBREAKERS

## Within Same Division

If 2 teams...

1. Best Overall Head to Head. (Example. Team A played Team B (3) times. Team A lost twice 3-2, and won once 4-1. Team A wins tiebreaker because they edged out Team B 8-7 overall in total head to head points).
2. Total Margin of victory in games in overall head to head matches .
3. Team that won at least 3 Matches in last head to head meeting.

## If more than 2 teams...

The tiebreakers will be applied with the end goal being to have 2 teams left standing such that the tiebreakers above (Only 2 teams from same division tied) will be applied.

1. Best Win/Loss Record (Percentage) in Head to Head with each other.

Example. Team A, B, and C all are 40-40 at the end of the session. Records against each other were
Team A defeated Team B 6-4 Overall

Team B defeated Team C 8-7 Overall

Team C defeated Team A 7-3 Overall

Therefore, their records against each other were
Team A.... 9-11 (.450), Team B.... 12-13 (.480), Team C.... 14-11 (.560)
Team A would be seeded $3^{\text {rd }}$. Teams $B$ and $C$ would then revert to tiebreaker procedures if only 2 teams from same division were tied. Team B would be seeded first because after Team A was eliminated in the applied tiebreakers, Team B beat Team C in Head to Head 8-7.
2. In the unlikely event that all teams above are tied with identical w/I percentage after first tiebreaker, next tiebreaker will be overall margin of victory in games in head to head matches.
3. In the very very unlikely event that no teams have been eliminated after \#1 and \#2 above, pills will be pulled to see what team gets eliminated so that eventually there are 2 teams left standing such that tiebreakers with only 2 teams from same division can be applied.

## In Different Divisions

If teams from different divisions are competing for wildcard spots (such as in the Monday "Solids" and "Stripes" divisions), seeding will be determined as follows....

1. Best Match win percentage.
2. Best Rack percentage.
3. Coin flip (If 2 teams). If more than 2 teams, pulling of pills. It is EXTREMELY unlikely that it would ever get to this point.

If teams from different divisions are competing for WILDCARD (Play-In) spots, no consideration will be given to records in head to head matches. For example, if 2 teams from solids and one team from stripes are competing for the last 2 remaining wildcard spots, no consideration will be given to the head to head record between the 2 teams that played in the solids division.
